ICF-BASED CLINICAL PRACTICE GUIDELINES POLICY COVER PAGE

Orthopaedic Section Board Liaison – James Irrgang, President

Purpose: In February 2005, the Section Board of Directors approved the development of the ICF-Based Clinical Practice Guidelines Project. The purpose of the project is to develop evidence-based clinical practice guidelines utilizing the framework of the International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF). A Work Group for a specific body region, recommended by the ICF Coordinator/Editor and approved by the Board of the Directors, will develop various guidelines that address examination, evaluation, diagnosis, prognosis, and assessment of outcome for the most common musculoskeletal conditions treated by orthopaedic physical therapists.

 Coordinator and Advisory Panel: ICF-Based Practice Guidelines Coordinator (ICF Coordinator) is appointed by the Section Board of Directors for a 3-year term. The ICF Coordinator appoints, with Board of Director approval, an ICF-Based Practice Guidelines Advisory Panel to review, edit, and approve guidelines submitted by Work Groups at the request of the ICF Coordinator. The ICF Advisory Panel consists of the ICF Coordinator, the Section Board of Directors Liaison, and content experts recommended by the ICF Coordinator. The term limit for ICF Advisory Panel members is 3 years and panel members can serve no more than two 3-year terms.

National Guidelines Clearinghouse (NGC) Coordinator: One Advisory Panel Member will be appointed by the ICF coordinator, with Board of Director approval, to be the NGC coordinator.

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Meetings: The ICF Advisory Panel will meet as deemed necessary by the ICF Coordinator. The ICF Coordinator will also attend the Orthopaedic Section Board of Directors meeting and business meeting at the APTA Combined Sections Meeting annually. In addition, the ICF Coordinator/Editor will organize and moderate a program that provides an update on the ICF-Based Clinical Practice Guidelines project each year at the APTA Combined Sections Meeting. Presenters/Panel members at this CSM program are typically (1) authors of recent or upcoming clinical practice guidelines, (2) Advisory Panel members instrumental in having these guidelines approved for submission to the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality's National Guidelines Clearinghouse (www.guidelines.gov).

ICF Coordinator/Editor Tasks: The ICF Coordinator will develop, define content, review, finalize, and update ICF-Based Practice Guidelines developed by the various Work Groups. The ICF Coordinator is expected to develop and/or finalize 3 to 4 practice guidelines annually for review by the ICF Advisory Panel, for a total of at least 15 guidelines by 2015. In addition, the ICF Coordinator will develop a plan for the update of all published ICF guidelines every 5-years.

National Guidelines Clearinghouse (NGC) Coordinator Tasks: The responsibility of the NGC coordinator is to ensure that guidelines published in JOSPT become accepted for placement on the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality's National Guidelines Clearinghouse website (www.guidelines.gov).

Work other than meetings: Ongoing throughout the year.

Qualifications:

ICF Coordinator/Editor: An Orthopaedic Section member who has the desire and the experience to identify potential work group members as well as promote and facilitate the success of the ICF Project. The position requires approximately 10 hours per week.

ICF Guidelines Revisions Coordinator/Editor: An Orthopaedic Section member who has the desire and the experience to coordinate the work group members' efforts to prepare practice guidelines revisions. Revisions for each guideline will be created once every 5 years and will provide a synopsis of relevant publications, potentially using the GRADE methodology, and revised recommendations for the clinical practice guidelines. The position requires approximately 5 hours per week.

NGC Coordinator: An Orthopaedic Section member who is an ICF Advisory Panel member. This position requires approximately 20 hours per guideline over the course of about 18 months for the process of submitting, revising and completing the process for a guideline to be accepted and placed on the NCG website.

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Compensation Policy: In the event that specific conditions or circumstances lead to a significant financial strain on the Section's Annual Budget the Section Board of Directors, based on a recommendation from the Finance Committee, will direct the Executive Director to discontinue all Stipends/Honorariums paid to Section members until fiscal solvency is attained.
