Performing Arts Fellowship

PASIG leaders are frequently approached by students that have a background in performing arts and want to know how to chart their career paths. We know from experience that no two paths are the same. But one thing most paths have in common is clinical mentorship from physical therapists currently working with performing artists. Our PASIG developed a Description of Fellowship Practice (DFP) for the Performing Arts, which serves as the curriculum guide for the three ABPTRFE accredited fellowship programs.
