## Academy of Orthopaedic Physical Therapy, APTA, Inc. Proposed Bylaws Amendments for Presentation to the Membership

**Background:** This proposal provides for amendments to the bylaws of the Academy of Orthopaedic Physical Therapy, APTA, Inc. for a change to the AOPT candidate recruitment and election schedule. Special Interest Group (SIG) candidate recruitment and election schedule remains the same.

2	Section 3:	Election Ballot

4		А.	AOPT Elections	
5			Elections for officers and non-officer directors shall be conducted	
6			via mailed ballot in November August of each year and	
7			coordinated by the Nominating Committee. Ballots shall permit	
8			voters to write in the name of a member who is qualified under	
9			Article VII, Section 1, and has given written consent to serve if	
10			elected. The Nominating Committee will present its selections in a	
11			October July mailing to all voting Academy members and post on	
12			the Academy Web Site. Additional candidates may be nominated	
13			by written petition of 25 members for each candidate. The petition	
14			candidates would be on the November <u>August</u> ballot mailing along	
15			with the candidates slated by the Nominating Committee. A	
16			minimum return of mail-in ballots consisting of valid ballots	
17			returned from at least five (5) percent of the eligible voters is	
18			required for the election to be valid. The results of the election	
19			shall be announced at the Annual Academy Membership Meeting.

21		В.	Special Interest Group Elections	
22			<b>Elections for AOPT Special Interest Groups (SIG) shall be</b>	
23			conducted via mailed ballot in November of each year and	
24			coordinated by the Nominating Committee of each SIG. Ballots	
25			shall permit voters to write in the name of a SIG member who	
26			is qualified under Article VII, Section 1, and has given written	
27			consent to serve if elected. The SIG Nominating Committee	
28			will present its selections in an October mailing to all voting	
29			SIG members and post on the SIG Web Site. Additional	
30			candidates may be nominated by written petition of 25	
31			members for each candidate. The petition candidates would be	
32			on the November ballot mailing along with the candidates	
33			slated by the SIG Nominating Committee. A minimum return	
34			consisting of valid ballots returned from at least five (5)	
35			percent of the eligible SIG voters is required for the election to	
36			be valid. The results of the election shall be announced at the	
37			Annual SIG Membership Meetings.

39	С.	The Nominating Committee, whenever possible, shall nominate at
40		least two (2) candidates for each position to be filled. In any
41		election for a Principal Officer position or for <u>a only one</u> Non-
42		officer Director position or for only one position on the
43		Nominating Committee, the candidate that receives the most votes
44		cast shall be elected. All ties shall be broken by drawing of lots by
45		the Nominating Committee.

47	D.	If two or more Non-officer Directors are to be elected under any
48		proviso to these bylaws for terms of different lengths, voters may
49		vote for up to as many positions as are to be filled, and the
50		candidates that receive the most votes shall be elected. In such a
51		case, the candidate that receives the most votes shall be deemed
52		elected to the position with the longest term, the candidate that
53		receives the next most votes shall be deemed elected to the
54		position with the next longest term, and so forth.

56	E.	If two or more members of the Nominating Committee are to be
57		elected under any proviso to these bylaws for terms of different
58		lengths, voters may vote for up to as many positions as are to be
59		filled, and the candidates that receive the most votes shall be
60		elected. In such a case, the candidate that receives the most votes
61		shall be deemed elected to the position with the longest term, the
62		candidate that receives the next most votes shall be deemed elected
63		to the position with the next longest term, and so forth.
