



The following are non-substantive changes:

- Participant Positions: A program may add 2 or less participant positions in one calendar year.
- <u>Change in Leadership</u>: A program may change its appointed program director or program coordinator.
- <u>Change in Patient Population</u>: A program may add additional practice sites to promote participant learning.
- <u>Addition of a New Mentor(s)</u>: A program may appoint new faculty mentors to the program.
