Outgoing President Tribute

Lorena Pettet Payne will be stepping down as President of the Occupational Health Special Interest Group and handing the reins over to the new elected President at CSM 2019. We would like to thank Lorena for her leadership over the past 6 years. Lori Deal DPT and Dee Daly DPT had the following words for Lorena:

Lorena's tireless efforts to advance understanding of what PT brings to Occupational Health have advanced the SIG and have opened doors to outside entities' interest in what PT has to offer. As recent examples, Lorena was instrumental in the Clinical Practice Guideline development project that will soon produce a published quideline for work rehabilitation. She spearheaded refreshing the documents our section hosts to educate others on occupational health and PT. Not only has that given other PT professionals a new resource, the content has already been utilized by the APTA's office in response to an inquiry from the National Occupational Research Agenda for Healthcare and Social Assistance. Lorena's efforts to advance our profession's involvement with the entities who have an effect on our practice continues. She helps ensure the SIG is part of evolving issues- monitoring and responding to emerging proposals, like proposed changes to Social Security determinations and the Occupational Requirements Survey (that will update the Dictionary of Occupational Titles). Within the last month, she met with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), which produces guidelines and provides oversight to U.S. employers for prevention of and response to injury and occupational illness/disease. She brought questions and concerns from OHSIG members to OSHA on a number of topics relevant to PTs and our work within employers' settings and with employees. During Lorena's tenure the SIG published a self study course, provided educational programming at CSM and coordinated efforts with the APTA employer initiative work group. Lorena's leadership in our SIG sets a high bar for our section's path and has advanced our involvement and exposure to external entities, as well as PTs interested in occupational health.

We discussed the role of physical therapists in the promotion of a healthy work force with OSHA Deputy Assistant Secretary Loren Sweatt, Director of Cooperative and State Programs Douglas Kalinowski, Director of Office of Outreach Services and Alliances Tina Jones, and two other key directors. During our meeting, similarities in our missions were identified. We reviewed the ways in which physical therapists are assisting industry. The framework for ongoing collaboration has been set. Immediately, members of the OHSIG can be instrumental in this collaboration by sharing the wealth of information available through OSHA. Tina Jones thanked APTA and OHSIG representatives for reaching out and for a productive meeting. Mentoring program

At CSM 2018 our members requested opportunities to mentor with more experienced physical therapists in the area of occupational health. A structured mentoring program is planned for launch at CSM 2019 OHSIG meeting at 6:45 am on Saturday, January 26th immediately preceding the OHSIG sponsored educational session. Information related to the mentor/mentee program can be found on the OHSIG webpage. This mentoring program has a defined time length of 6

months with a suggestion of at least 1 interaction per month via phone/web camera/in person. Because occupational health covers a wide range of topics the program is further divided into 4 general specialty areas:

- a. Prevention: ergonomics, wellness programs, post offer testing
- b. WC regulatory environment: insurance, state laws
- c. Treatment: traditional therapy under Worker's Compensation, specialty industrial programs (FCEs, work conditioning/work hardening)
- d. On-site prevention and treatment programming

Description:

Ergonomic and psychosocial risk factors both play a role in musculoskeletal injury risk. Ergonomic coaching has the potential to not only mitigate the ergonomic risk factors but also improve self-efficacy, decrease fear avoidance, and reduce the incidence of disability by returning patients back to function sooner. In addition to the traditional outpatient setting, physical therapists can provide services in the workplace, such as designing workplace exercise programs, ergonomic job analyses, body mechanics training, and job rotation planning. This session will review basic ergonomic principles and risk factors, and review the evidence supporting their application to Orthopaedics Section practice. The presenters will discuss the physical therapist's role in the workplace setting, including ergonomic methods and tools as well as overall health promotion. Practical application models will be demonstrated and discussed for different time periods along the care continuum. A case study will further illustration the application of these concepts.
